4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

First Aid Measures

General Advice	Provide this SDS to medical personnel for treatment.
Eye Contact	Flush eyes with large amounts of water. Do not try to neutralize with chemical agents. Get medical attention.
Skin Contact	Immediately remove contaminated clothing. Flush with water or soap and water for 15 minutes or until all traces have been removed. Seek medical attention if symptoms develop and persist.
Inhalation	Remove victim to fresh air and, if needed, immediately begin artificial respiration. Give oxygen if breathing is labored. Get emergency medical help. Contact a physician immediately.
Ingestion	Do not induce vomiting, unless directed by medical personnel. Get immediate medical attention.

Most important symptoms and effects

Symptoms	Active ingredient is corrosive. Methanol is a cumulative toxin readily absorbed by the skin. Contact with eyes may cause corneal damage. Avoid continuous exposure. Can cause dizziness, unconsciousness, cardiac depression, optic complications or death if inhaled. Toxic by ingestion, may cause blindness, narcosis, nausea and death.
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Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed

Notes to Physician	Provide general supportive measures and treat symptomatically. Symptoms may be delayed. Ethanol and fomepizole are effective antidotes for methanol poisoning, although fomepizole is preferred.
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5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Protective equipment and precautions for firefighters
